If you are wondering how to best support your child with securing a placement, then take a look at our top tips below...



Have an open conversation with your child about their career aspirations and encourage them to search for virtual work experience which is linked to these



Help your child to be realistic - although there are lots of placements on offer, they may not be able to find one in the exact industry they are interested in. In such cases, look for work experience which will develop strong transferable skills such as research and organisation

In this issue, we sat down (virtually!) with Ms Blight, the Careers Ambassador for Computing at Maiden Erlegh School...

WHAT DO YOU DO IN YOUR ROLE AS CAREERS AMBASSADOR FOR COMPUTING?

I prepare resources for each of the calendared #Careers Weeks and promote opportunities for students to get involved in extra-

curricular work experience and activities with industry links, either virtually or in person. The careers board in our department reflects the broad range of jobs available in the industry. I also promote technical competitions throughout the year and last summer I created a video to promote STEAM Careers for the Year 7 Virtual STEAM Day.

WHY WERE YOU INTERESTED IN BECOMING A CAREERS AMBASSADOR?

Having enjoyed a career in Technology before becoming a teacher, I am aware of the variety of roles within this industry - there really is a role to suit everyone. However, there are misconceptions about jobs in Computing and I want to challenge these and raise awareness of the opportunities that exist.

Being a Careers Ambassador also allows me to make use of my contacts and increase the links between the school and the industry.

WHY SHOULD STUDENTS CONSIDER A CAREER IN AN INDUSTRY RELATED TO COMPUTING?

Computing is one of the fastest growing, if not the fastest growing, industry.

The importance of technology in the modern world cannot be denied.

In a Computing career, each day is varied and there is such a range of roles and opportunities. These can include some unexpected aspects such as international travel.

I was lucky enough to work in Silicon Valley in San Francisco for a month with a development team there, which was amazing.
