Whether you are awaiting and preparing for GCSE Results Day, or the day has arrived, and you have received your results, this booklet is designed to help you navigate preparing for GCSE Results Day, the results day itself, and beyond.

You will already have applied for Post 16 opportunities – which may have included one or more of the following main options – Sixth Form/s, F.E. College/s and/or an Apprenticeship/s.

GCSE Results Day: Whether you are pleased, relieved, or disappointed with your GCSE results – please know that there will be an option for you. Please know it is still possible to achieve your goals, even if you might be taking a detour or discovering exciting new possibilities. The following information is to help you, no matter your situation today.

Your immediate next steps...

- ✓ **Check** your grades against grades required (for conditional offers).
- ✓ **Consider** what you would like to do / what is an option for you now that you have received your GCSE grades.

If you achieved the required GCSE grades / have an unconditional offer, you can...

- 1) **Confirm your acceptance of an existing offer** from a school, college, or apprenticeship place – do so today, if this is possible.
- OR**
- 2) **Potentially find an alternative option** to your original plan / place – contact alternative options today, if possible.

It is important you ACT TODAY!

If you did not quite meet the GCSE grades you needed, you can:

- 1) **Contact** the Sixth Form / college or apprenticeship employer to discuss the grades you achieved – they may still be able to offer you a place.
- 2) **Contact** other Sixth Forms / colleges to see if they have any spaces for the subject/s you are interested in.

It is important you ACT TODAY!

****You will need to act quickly today** by contacting schools / colleges / apprenticeship employers.

*You may be asked to **attend face to face, telephone or apply online*****

*****Be prepared: take copies of GCSE results + a form/s of I.D. (formal identification)*****

***It is important** to have a place at school, college, on an apprenticeship or traineeship as your start Year 12.*

Top tip: Check enrolment arrangements for colleges/sixth forms you have applied for – in advance of GCSE results day.

A reminder of what your Post 16 options potentially include:

1) **Studying A levels (+/- vocational qualification/s) at Sixth Form or a local F.E. College:**

Please note: this list is not an exhaustive list of schools within the area.

Schools may also operate on a catchment area basis (e.g. you will need to live a certain distance from the school).

- 2) **Vocational Courses:** These are work-related courses delivered by colleges and are available at different levels, to suit your GCSE qualifications – ranging from creative to construction to computing to engineering to vehicle maintenance to media and many more subjects. Some colleges also offer A-levels or Applied Levels (a combination between coursework and exams). Entry requirements for level 3 courses such as BTEC (A Level equivalent) are usually GCSE grades 4 and 5 which is a bit lower than some schools/colleges for A-levels. You might also consider the level 2 courses which usually ask for grades 3 and above. Many courses are offered at all the local colleges.

- 3) Some subjects like catering, construction trades, animal care and horticulture are only offered at some of the colleges so, again, check all these details carefully. Popular courses may already have waiting lists.

Local Further Education Colleges include:

- **BCA** – Agricultural College near Maidenhead that specialises in Animal Management, Agriculture and Sport, among others: <https://www.bca.ac.uk/>

- 4) **Apprenticeship** – Apprenticeships combine work with study for a qualification. You are paid a salary. You can find out more about apprenticeships and search for vacancies in your local area on the official government apprenticeship site: <https://www.findapprenticeship.service.gov.uk/apprenticeshipsearch> .

You can start an apprenticeship straight after GCSEs (Intermediate level and Advanced level, and sometimes even at Higher level – depending on entry requirements / your GCSE grades). Some apprenticeships can be followed all the way through to Higher/Degree level. You can search for apprenticeships using the website links below:

******It is important you keep your place at school or college / apply for college / sixth form if you do not yet have a confirmed place for an apprenticeship. You can take a one-year college course, and apply for apprenticeships while you are at college******

5) Traineeship

A traineeship is a course with work experience that gets you ready for work or an apprenticeship. It can last up to 6 months.

You can apply if you're:

- eligible to work in England
- unemployed and have little or no work experience
- aged 16 to 24 and qualified below Level 3

It is important to be in some form of education, training or employment with training – there are a great number of options and back-up options + support available to help you.

Advice: It is best to start a college course / take a college course which lasts 1 year – if you have not already secured an apprenticeship / traineeship.

Specific Instructions from local Further Education Colleges can be found below:-

BCA, Maidenhead:



The following information and guidance is directly from BCA:

1. **If you have already applied to BCA**, you will receive guidance on how to enrol over the summer before GCSE results are announced. Enrolment for September 2024 students will take place from August 21st to 30th August.
2. **If you have already applied, been interviewed, and received a conditional/unconditional offer**, you will receive an invitation to book an enrolment slot by July 19th. If you don't receive an invite, you can email the college at admissions@windsor-forest.ac.uk.
3. **If you are planning to apply for a college course on GCSE Results Day**, some courses may already be full and have waiting lists. It is advised to contact the college and speak to someone in the relevant department to check if there are any vacancies on your chosen course. You can call BCA at 01628 824444 or email admissions@windsor-forest.ac.uk. Keep in mind that the college may be very busy during this time.
4. **Before enrolling**, students with a conditional or unconditional offer will need to complete pre-enrolment. This involves creating and logging into their College account, uploading a photo for their ID badge, providing a form of ID, and completing pre-enrolment forms.
5. **On the day of enrolment**, students should bring a copy of their GCSE certificates/results and proof of ID if they haven't already uploaded this to their College account. It is also important to check the Joining Instruction pages on the college website for each department, as there may be additional documents or requirements specific to your chosen course that they may need to bring with them to enrolment - <https://www.bca.ac.uk/enrol/>

Henley College

The following information and guidance are directly from Henley College:

1. Students who have already applied for Henley College will be sent a full enrolment handbook over the summer with everything they need to know about our enrolment process with details on how to enrol on chosen courses.
2. **Week commencing 29 July** – all applicants will receive a card through the post entitled '5 Simple Steps to Enrol'. Step 1 contains a QR code which should be scanned to take you through to the 'Enrolment Desk'.
3. Those students who have already applied and accepted their conditional offer for the college + sent ID to the Admissions Team (via the portal or email) will need to head to the 'Enrolment Desk' (link will be provided via Handbook being sent out OR use the QR code within the '5 Simple Step to Enrol' document).
4. **Please note:** for conditional offers to be honoured by the college – student's **'Statement of Results' MUST be uploaded by MIDDAY on Friday 23 August.**
5. **On GCSE results day** – students must upload a copy of their 'Statement of Results' in order to enrol. Please upload your results if you have met the entry requirements for your chosen course or not.
6. We advise that all students who have not accepted their offer do so + send valid ID before enrolment. Valid ID includes a UK passport valid 5 September 2024 OR a Birth Certificate + a letter addressed to the student (e.g. National Insurance letter) OR if a non-UK passport – it must be accompanied by a BRP – Biometric Resident Permit OR the Settlement Status Code.
7. Students wishing to apply for a college course on GCSE Results Day. Should apply by clicking the 'Apply Now' button in the top right-hand corner at www.henleycol.ac.uk/apply-online. Please have your 'Statement of Results' + valid ID (see above) ready to upload.
8. We shall have a GCSE advisory line which will go live on GCSE results day. The number for this will be: **01491 63 43 21**
9. All students will need to enrol online.

Reading College and Bracknell & Wokingham College (Activate Learning)

The following information and guidance are directly from the Central Advice and Admissions from Activate Learning colleges:

1. The phone number that the applicants can call regarding their GCSE results will be 0800 612 6008.
2. Documents students would be required to bring include their GCSE results, proof of ID and sometimes the requested visa documents.
3. The applicants would not need to attend college to enrol onto the course as the enrolment form would be sent through email and we expect them to email us back with the completed enrolment form. The only other situation where they might need to come to college regarding their enrolment would be when we ask them to create and collect their physical ID card at the College. They can report to the reception for this and the receptionist would be able to guide them on where to go next.
4. The next steps for applicants who have accepted their conditional/unconditional offers would be to complete their enrolment form which would be sent out to them through their email during August (before GCSE Results Day). Students need to upload a copy of their GCSE Results with the enrolment form.
5. The next steps for applicants, who don't achieve the conditions to their offer, is that the college will automatically move applicants to the next level of course. This will be done automatically. If students wish to change their course completely – they should call the Activate Learning team on 0800 612 6008.
7. You can apply for courses via the college websites OR call/email the Admissions Team.
6. Applicants who are interested in applying to a course on GCSE Results Day, will need to go through our clearing courses that are available to them.

Please keep an eye on your emails from the college + check your spam/junk email folder.
