



Careers in Uniformed Services

The uniformed services are roles to help aid and protect the public. Job security is generally high, with good starting salaries for graduates and the potential to advance further within your field. There is an element of risk when working within the uniformed services and your actions can directly affect this so good decisionmaking skills are essential.











Working for the Police service

There are several ways to join the police, and in 2020 there was a major change to the recruitment process, meaning you'll need to have at least a degree-level qualification by the time you complete your probation.

Police officers work in partnership with the communities they serve to maintain law and order, protect members of the public and property, and detect, prevent and investigate crimes. It is a challenging career that demands a high level of personal integrity and responsibility.

The UK has 45 geographical police forces - that's 43 in England and Wales (Greater Manchester Police, Suffolk Constabulary, Gwent Police, etc.) plus Police Scotland and the Police Service of Northern Ireland.

In addition, there are four special police forces:

British Transport Police - responsible for policing the railway network.

Civil Nuclear Constabulary - protects civilian nuclear facilities.

Ministry of Defence Police - security for the UK's defence assets.

National Police Air Service - air support for English and Welsh police forces.

Working in the Fire and Rescue Service

As a firefighter, you will be called upon to tackle various emergency situations where your problem solving skills and initiative will be vital to resolve issues quickly and calmly. Incidents vary from tackling fires and rescuing people from burning buildings to dealing with chemical spillages and Road Traffic Collisions (RTCs).

There are certain personal attributes you will need to fulfil within your role as a firefighter. These include confidence, resilience, adaptability, ability to communicate effectively, integrity and have a commitment to diversity. The role of the firefighter is continually changing as new techniques and equipment are introduced. As well as responding to emergencies, you will also be expected to work closely with the community.

Working for the Ambulance service

If you have a caring nature, good communication and organisational skills and an ability to stay calm, an ambulance service career could be the one for you. As a paramedic, you'll often be one of the first to arrive when a patient needs help. It's a fast-paced and vital role where you'll need to quickly take charge of the situation to save lives. As well as a paramedic, there are many other roles available, from ambulance care assistant and patient transport service, to call handler to emergency medical technician. There are 11 ambulance services in the UK, with South Central Ambulance Service serving the Berkshire area.


